In Australia, individuals are encouraged to indicate their donation wishes on the AODR. Around 30% of the population have recorded their donation decision on the AODR or it is historically recorded on their driving licence. Donation staff will check the AODR for all referrals and the staff discussing organ donation with the family are encouraged to share the information recorded on the AODR with the family as part of the donation discussion. South Australians can also record their preference on their driver's licence. In New Zealand, there is no national organ donor register although the Human Tissue Act 2008 allows for the possible future establishment of a register by regulation. Every applicant for a vehicle driver licence is required to tick either Yes or No to the question 'Would you be willing to donate organs in the event of your death?' as a prerequisite to obtaining a licence.
